Chuck Stuart entuses us about clinic

At his 30th appearance before the Clay Center Rotary Club, Chuck cut a different swathe than his former 29 "back to school editions." He has been picked as the Chairman of the fund raising committee for the proposed new doctors clinic.

With his exuberance, it was not difficult for Chuck to enthuse his audience in this erst while cause. Chuck said there are several reasons for the community to support the clinic and to raise the needed \$300,000 from private contributions. One good reason was the good feeling in doing something for others. Also it is a good project for the community to be able to look beyond ourselves.

We have a unique county hospital set up with six doctors, two doctor's assistants and one surgeon. They now work under less than ideal conditions. The proposed clinic to be built on the southwest corner of the hospital will give the doctors ample room and will prove to be a drawing card for patients in our hospital.

Chuck said the most searching questions we have to ask ourselves are; (1) Do we want a hospital, (2) Do we want good medical service. At the present time the hospital is a 3 1/2 million dollar business with 100 full and part time employees. The new clinic would increase the income to about another million dollars, Chuck believes.

In his remarks, Chuck paid tribute to two former Rotarians. Bill Schlichter who lived a long, full life for his dedication to service towards his fellow men. And to George J. Heffel who did so much for his adopted community probably contributing to his untimely death.

John Browne introduced Chuck and Frank Oberg paid Chuck compliments as he thanked him for his talk.
