# Little Snowflake, You Are One of a Kind

In Tennessee where I grew up, snows were infrequent. If it snowed, it was an exciting event! I can remember going outside at recess at school and literally dancing around in the snow, sticking out my tongue to catch the cold, icy snowflakes.

After a new snow, I remember making snow ice cream and getting brain-freeze from eating the snow ice cream too fast. Making snow ice cream still brings back pleasant memories, and it probably took thousands of snowflakes to make one pan of snow ice cream.

I never thought about what a tiny snowflake might look like if magnified. But a young man named Wilson Bentley did. He was born in Jericho, Vermont, in 1865—snow was plentiful in Vermont. When Wilson was fifteen, his mother gave him an old microscope. That's when Wilson became curious about what an enlarged snowflake might look like. After much trial and error, he became the first person to photograph a magnified snowflake. During his lifetime, he photographed over 5,000

snowflakes and became known as "Snowflake Bentley." In December, 1931, Wilson died of pneumonia on his farm after walking six miles in a blizzard to photograph more snowflakes!

He was only sixty-six years old, but he left behind a large collection of photographs of snowflakes.

Because of Wilson Bentley's work, we have learned snowflakes have six sides with an almost infinite number of possible variations.

Snowflakes are formed from moisture droplets from clouds when the air temperature is 32 degrees or colder. Air currents, the moisture content of clouds, and the air temperature influences the size, shape, and what a snowflake will look like. The largest snowflake recorded in the Guinness World Records book fell at Fort Keogh, Montana, on January 28, 1887. It was 15 inches wide and 8 inches thick! A magnifying glass was not needed to view that snowflake! The shapes of snowflakes are delicate and intricate, but they are not always symmetrical. No two

snowflakes are identical in shape and size. Each flake has its own characteristics and beauty—each is totally unique.

It would be difficult to find two people who are exactly alike since people have different personalities and come in different shapes, sizes, and from different nationalities and backgrounds. People have different voice patterns and different DNA. We have different fingerprints that begin forming before we are born. Even twins have different fingerprints, and our fingerprints help identify who we are! We have different talents, different likes and dislikes, unique idiosyncrasies and talents. We have different colored eyes, hair, skin, and facial features. We respond to stress in different ways, sometimes in the same way as our parents, and sometimes differently! We are individuals—we are unique! Snowflakes have similarities,

and so do people, but overall we are more different than similar. People, like snowflakes, are unique.

At some point in our life, we will all experience the death of someone we love. And like snowflakes and people, grief experiences may have some similarities and differences. Our time tables for healing may vary, depending on our relationship with the one who died, the nature of the loss, and the age of the person who died.

If someone seems to move through the grief process faster, slower, or differently from you, that person is probably grieving in ways that are normal for him/her. If you are grieving, remember the snowflakes! You too are a unique, beautiful person in your own right, and your grief journey will be different too. May your grief journey guide you to hope, healing, and a fulfilling life!
